## 4. Appositives

An appositive is a noun-phrase placed beside a noun to explain it more fully. It is a key tool in making your sentences more interesting and more concise; they are useful to convey a large amount of information in the minimum number of words.

Consider the two sentences.

"The Iroquois lived in the north east. They were a farmer-gatherer community."

Using an appositive, this could be rendered:

"The Iroquois, a farmer-gatherer community, lived in the north east."

Or "A farmer-gatherer community, the Iroquois lived in the north east."
