In her book, *The Writing Revolution* Judith Hochman tells us that students' problems with reading comprehension, as well with writing essays, occur because they have not been taught systematically to write ... to which her book gives a step-by-step guide.

The Writing Development exercises here are adapted from her programme.

The Terms of the Treaty

4. Appositives

An appositive is a noun-phrase placed beside a noun to explain it more fully. It is a key tool in making your sentences more interesting and more concise; they are useful to convey a large amount of information in the minimum number of words.

You use an appositive to explain or expand an idea in the text.

You can frame an appositive using commas, but I tend to use brackets or en-dashes ('-') instead.

Consider the following sentence:

"On 25 March Lloyd George issued the Fontainebleau Memorandum."

On the webpage I was able to provide a hyperlink for anybody who doesn't know what the Fontainebleau Memorandum was. In an essay, however, you would need to explain it. You could do so in two sentences:

"On 25 March Lloyd George issued the Fontainebleau Memorandum. The Fontainebleau Memorandum was a public statement supporting the League of Nations."

But it is less clumsy to use an appositive:

- Or "On 25 March Lloyd George issued the Fontainebleau Memorandum, a public statement supporting the League of Nations."
